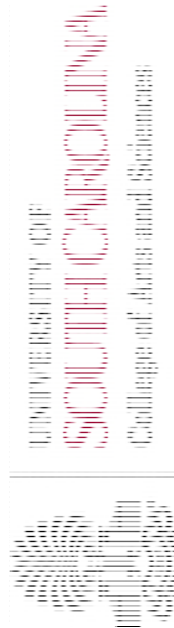

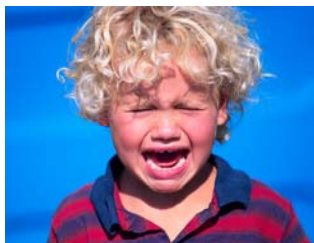

Especially when your child is disobedient, aggressive, or has tantrums.

Help is at hand!

Families who qualify will participate in a three-month program called Triple P.

This program will help you learn how to:

- Deal effectively with problem behaviors when they occur, such as disobedience, aggression, fighting, tantrums, bedtime problems, and shopping problems.
- Build a supportive family environment and a more positive relationship with your child.
- Encourage behavior you like.
- Teach your children the skills they need to get along with others.



The program is provided to you **FREE** of charge.

The Child and Family Program

The USC Parenting & Family Research Center is conducting a study to evaluate the program. Participants in the Child & Family Program get to enjoy the parenting help for no charge.

You may qualify to participate if:

- You are the parent of a 3-7 year old child who is showing challenging levels of problem behaviors.
- Neither you or your child are currently receiving any parenting support services or treatment for your child's emotional or behavioral problems.
- You speak, read, and understand English.
- You have regular access to the internet.



How your participation would work:

- Contact us by phone to find out if you qualify and to get more information.
- If you qualify, we would ask you and your child to visit our office downtown at the USC Parenting & Family Research Center; parents living in the home are both encouraged to participate.
- During your initial visit, we will describe the study to you and answer any questions you have.
- All families accepted into the study and who agree to participate will receive the program for parents.
