The PAP's (Patient Assistance Programs) collect the information from the consumer and use this to complete all of the applications and work with the drug companies to approve the applicant for free medications for the fee listed.

It is then up to the individual to complete each application and return to the respective drug company.

RETAIL PHARMACIES

Wal-Mart - \$4 for 30 days/\$10 for 90 days on select medications. List of select medications can be found online (www.walmart.com) or a hard copy can be picked up at Wal-Mart pharmacy.

Target - \$4 for 30 days/\$10 for 90 days on select medications. List of select medications can be found online (www.target.com) or a hard copy can be picked up at Target pharmacy.

Kroger - \$4 for 30 days/\$10 for 90 on select generic medications. List of select medications can be found online (www.kroger.com). Some Medicare prescriptions are available for \$2. List online.

Publix – Offers free antibiotics.

Rite Aid - \$8.99 for 30 days/\$15.99 for 90 days. Save 20% on generic medications not listed. Save 15% on brand name medications not listed. Must have the “Wellness + Card” that is free from the store.
